











SIMBA SCOUT SAFARI







 - Duration: 3 nights, with 2 days in the field (Year-round).
 - Contribution to MWC: \$2,500 per person (Max 4 guests).



LION COLLARING SAFARI







Be armed with patience as this operation is easier said than done!

- Impact: Aid efforts to protect lions through reducing human-wildlife conflict.
- Duration: 6 nights, with max 5 days spent in the field.
 - Contribution to MWC: \$25,000 per collaring (Max 2 guests).



AERIAL WILDLIFE CENSUS SAFARI





Take to the skies for a bird's-eye view of wildlife conservation in action. Fly with MWC's aerial census team as they monitor and record key wildlife data.

- Impact: Contribute to the seasonal monitoring of key wildlife species.
- Duration: 3 nights, with 1 day prepping and 1 day flying (End May wet season) or (End September dry season).
 - Contribution to MWC: \$8,000 per aircraft (Max 2 guests, Max 2 aircrafts).



WILDLIFE PAYS SAFARI



Step into the role of a Verifying Officer, investigating livestock predation incidents in a forensic Crime Scene Investigator-style experience. Examine the evidence, identify the predator culprit, and learn how MWC's innovative compensation program fosters coexistence between humans and wildlife.

- Impact: Support the innovative compensation program that promotes coexistence between herders and predators.
 - Duration: 3 nights, with 2 days in the field (Year-round best times June September).
 - Contribution to MWC: \$2,500 per person (Max 2 Guests).



LIVELIHOODS SAFARI





Connect with Maasai women and immerse yourself in their inspiring livelihoods projects that blend tradition, sustainability, and empowerment.

Create exquisite Maasai beadwork alongside these talented artisans, knowing your efforts support their income and preserve cultural heritage.

Alternatively, join them in harvesting grass seeds that are sold for vital restoration projects, helping to revive degraded lands and to sustain their communities.

- Impact: Empower Maasai women, support sustainable incomes, and restore degraded landscapes.
- Duration: 3 nights, with 2 days in the field (February and June).
- Contribution to MWC: \$2,500 per person (Max 4 Guests).



CARBON SAFARI



Explore Mzima Springs and the lush Cloud Forest at the top of the Chyulu Hills and learn about the innovative REDD+ carbon project that combats climate change, protects critical habitats, and supports local communities.

- Impact: Support climate mitigation efforts.
- Duration: 5 nights, with 4 days in the field (Year-round).
- Contribution to MWC: \$3,000 per person (Max 4 Guest.





WALK WITH RANGERS

Experience conservation on the frontlines by accompanying MWC rangers on a wildlife monitoring patrol. Learn how they use SMART (Spatial Monitoring and Reporting Tool) to collect data and visit MWC's HQ to see how the data is analysed and used for conservation planning.


- Impact: Help MWC rangers safeguard wildlife, deter illegal activities, and monitor biodiversity.

- Contribution to MWC: \$2,500 per person (Max 2 Guests).




